


LUKE 24:30-31 (NKJV)

GENESIS 2:21-22 (NKJV)

²¹ And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall on Adam, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh in its place.

²² Then the rib which the LORD God had taken from man He made into a woman, and He brought her to the man.

FULFILLMENT**Jesus and the Church (The Bride)****JOHN 19:33-34 (NKJV)**

³³ But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs.

³⁴ But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.

- We (the church) are the bride of Christ. (Ephesians 5:22-33)
- The church is redeemed by the **Blood** of Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:7) and the church is sanctified by the water of the Word of God. (John 17:17; Ephesians 5:26).
- Therefore, while dead on the cross; the assignment of Jesus Christ was not complete until the church was birthed.
- His side was pierced, and blood and water gushed out from His side.

EXAMPLE 2

Abraham and Isaac

GENESIS 22:6A (NKJV)

6 So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid *it* on Isaac his son;

FULFILLMENT

JOHN 19:16–17 (NKJV)

16 Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. Then they took Jesus and led Him away.

17 And He, bearing His own cross, went out to a place called the Place of the Skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha.

- Read the entire chapter of Genesis 22.
- The willingness of Abraham to freely sacrifice his son Isaac is a foreshadow of Our Lord willingly and freely sacrificing His one and only son Jesus Christ.
- Isaac was the only covenant child of Abraham.

EXAMPLE 3

Moses and The Israelites

NUMBERS 21:8–9 (NIV)

⁸ The LORD said to Moses, “Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live.”

⁹ So Moses made a **bronze** snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the **bronze** snake, they lived.

- The **bronze** serpent was a foreshadowing of Jesus Christ. Bronze symbolizes judgement.
- The serpents that killed, was a symbol of sin lifted from the earth and put on ...
- A tree so that it could be cursed (judged).
(Cursed is anyone who hangs on a pole/tree (Galatians 3:13)).
- The serpent lifted and cursed symbolized Jesus, who takes away sin from everyone who would look to Him in faith.
(He became sin who knew no sin so that we may become the righteousness of God – 2 Cor 5:21)

FULFILLMENT

John 3:14-15 (NKJV)

¹⁴ And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up,

¹⁵ that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.



GENESIS 40:1-23

(NKJV)

The Prisoners' Dreams

¹ It came to pass after these things *that the butler and the baker of the king of Egypt offended their lord, the king of Egypt.*

² And Pharaoh was angry with his two officers, the chief butler and the chief baker.

³ So he put them in custody in the house of the captain of the guard, in the prison, the place where Joseph was confined.

⁴ And the captain of the guard charged Joseph with them, and he served them; so they were in custody for a while.

⁵ Then the butler and the baker of the king of Egypt, who *were* confined in the prison, had a dream, both of them, each man's dream in one night *and* each man's dream with its *own* interpretation.

⁶ And Joseph came in to them in the morning and looked at them, and saw that they *were* sad.

⁷ So he asked Pharaoh's officers who *were* with him in the custody of his lord's house, saying, "Why do you look *so* sad today?"

⁸ And they said to him, "We each have had a dream, and *there is* no interpreter of it." So Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell *them* to me, please."

⁹ Then the chief butler told his dream to Joseph, and said to him, “Behold, in my dream a vine was before me,

¹⁰ and in the vine were three branches; it was as though it budded, its blossoms shot forth, and its clusters brought forth ripe grapes.

¹¹ Then Pharaoh’s cup was in my hand; and I took the grapes and pressed them into Pharaoh’s cup, and placed the cup in Pharaoh’s hand.”

¹² And Joseph said to him, “This *is* the interpretation of it: The three branches are three days.

¹³ Now within three days Pharaoh will lift up your head and restore you to your place, and you will put Pharaoh's cup in his hand according to the former manner, when you were his butler.

¹⁴ But remember me when it is well with you, and please show kindness to me; make mention of me to Pharaoh, and get me out of this house.

¹⁵ For indeed I was stolen away from the land of the Hebrews; and also I have done nothing here that they should put me into the dungeon."

¹⁶ When the chief baker saw that the interpretation was good, he said to Joseph, “I also was in my dream, and there were three white baskets on my head.

¹⁷ In the uppermost basket were all kinds of baked goods for Pharaoh, and the birds ate them out of the basket on my head.”

¹⁸ So Joseph answered and said, “This *is* the interpretation of it: The three baskets are three days.

¹⁹ Within three days Pharaoh will lift off your head from you and hang you on a tree; and the birds will eat your flesh from you.”

²⁰ Now it came to pass on the third day, *which was* Pharaoh's birthday, that he made a feast for all his servants; and he lifted up the head of the chief butler and of the chief baker among his servants.

²¹ Then he restored the chief butler to his butlership again, and he placed the cup in Pharaoh's hand.

²² But he hanged the chief baker, as Joseph had interpreted to them.

²³ Yet the chief butler did not remember Joseph, but forgot him.

- Pharoah is "offended" by the chief butler and chief baker. (Jesus became sin who knew no sin... 2 Cor 5:21).
("Offended" // Hebrew word - Chata // Meaning - to miss, go wrong, sin).
- The chief butler - the blood of Jesus Christ
- The chief baker - the body of Jesus Christ
- 3 branches - 3 days
- 3 white baskets - 3 days
- The blood restores our identity - The Chief butler was restored.
- Hang on a tree and birds eat your flesh - Jesus on the cross and His body broken.

⁹ Finally, the king's chief cup-bearer spoke up. "Today I have been reminded of my failure," he told Pharaoh.

¹⁰ "Some time ago, you were angry with the chief baker and me, and you imprisoned us in the palace of the captain of the guard.

¹¹ One night the chief baker and I each had a dream, and each dream had its own meaning.

¹² There was a young Hebrew man with us in the prison who was a slave of the captain of the guard. We told him our dreams, and he told us what each of our dreams meant.

¹³ And everything happened just as he had predicted. I was restored to my position as cup-bearer, and the chief baker was executed and impaled on a pole."

Joseph Made Ruler of Egypt

³⁷ Joseph's suggestions were well received by Pharaoh and his officials.

³⁸ So Pharaoh asked his officials, "Can we find anyone else like this man so obviously filled with the spirit of God?"

³⁹ Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, "Since God has revealed the meaning of the dreams to you, clearly no one else is as intelligent or wise as you are."

⁴⁰ You will be in charge of my court, and all my people will take orders from you. Only I, sitting on my throne, will have a rank higher than yours."

⁴¹ Pharaoh said to Joseph, “I hereby put you in charge of the entire land of Egypt.”

⁴² Then Pharaoh removed his signet ring from his hand and placed it on Joseph’s finger. He dressed him in fine linen clothing and hung a gold chain around his neck.

⁴³ Then he had Joseph ride in the chariot reserved for his second-in-command. And wherever Joseph went, the command was shouted, “Kneel down!” So Pharaoh put Joseph in charge of all Egypt.

44 And Pharaoh said to him, “I am Pharaoh, but no one will lift a hand or foot in the entire land of Egypt without your approval.”

45 Then Pharaoh gave Joseph a new Egyptian name, Zaphenath-paneah. He also gave him a wife, whose name was Asenath. She was the daughter of Potiphera, the priest of On. So Joseph took charge of the entire land of Egypt.

JOHN 6:53-56 (NIV)



53 Jesus said to them, “Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

54 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day.

55 For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them.

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed,
took bread,

²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, “This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.”
